Resear pecially fodent iteracy/reading levels decrease over the summer prevalent. Richard Allington, a literacy expert found that this gap in literacy evel can be extinguished if students have access to books over the summer and encouraged to read during the summer. This project would help us provide tudents with books over the summer.

## MOVE IT, MOVE IT!

Students who have dyslexia have a hard time staying focused and struggle with reading. Many of them are hyperactive and impulsive, so adding kinesthetic ovement to the classroom will help them focus in reading. Movement increases learning because more senses are involved. Research has shown that students with dyslexia learn better, when it is multi-sensory lesson. The more senses used, the more areas of the brain that are going to be stimulated and more learning is going to take place. If we added a 6 -person strider desk to the classroom, it can potentially increase their engagement and participation in class.
